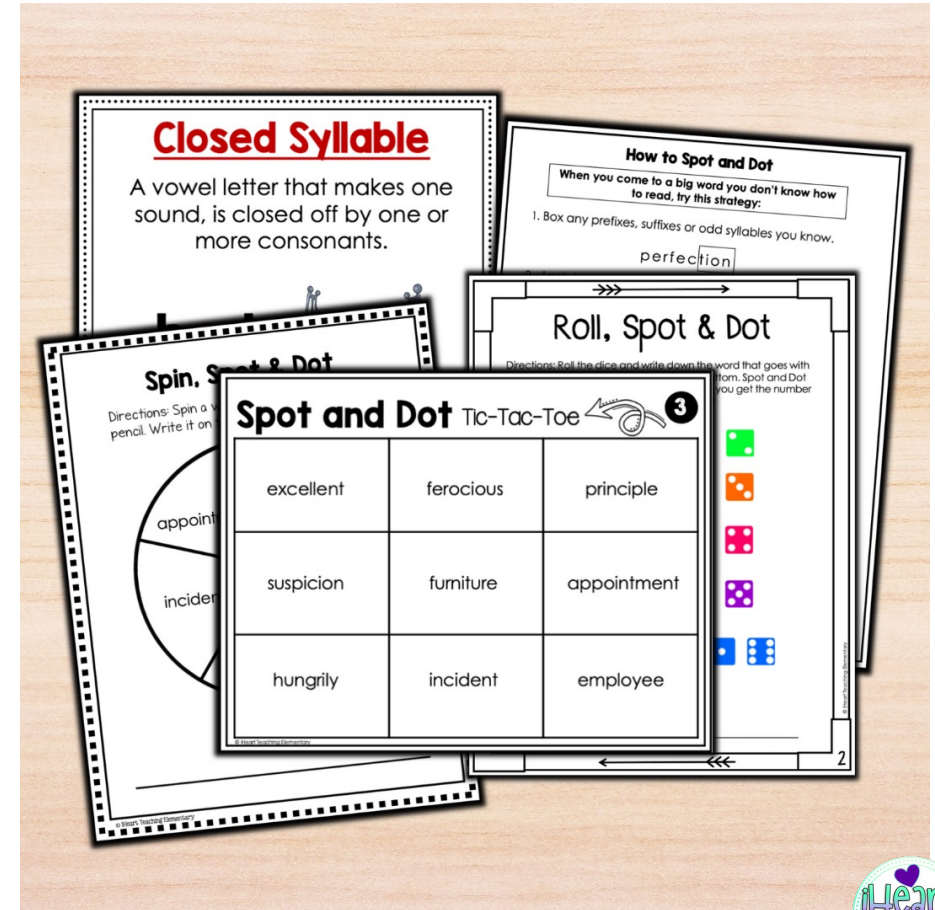

Decoding 2 & 3 Syllable Words

Roll, Spot & Dot

Directions: Roll the die and write down the word that goes with the number you rolled. Spot and Dot the word. If you break up the word correctly you get the number of points that you rolled!

appointment 
incident 
excellent 
adorable 
clarify 

Vowel-Consonant
A long vowel is spelled with a vowel letter and is followed by a consonant letter.

kite
The syllable on the left is a vowel sound and the syllable on the right is a consonant sound.

Open Syllable
The syllable ends with a vowel sound.

hi
The syllable ends with a consonant sound.

Vowel
Usually two, three, or four letters.

bed
The syllable ends with a consonant sound.

Schwa
Short and long vowel sounds don't always sound like the letters they represent. A schwa is a short, neutral vowel sound.

ebra
The syllable ends with a consonant sound.

Odd Syllables
Odd syllables have an odd number of letters.

pen, door, when, when, when, when, when
pen: /pen/ door: /dɔːr/ when: /wen/ when: /wen/ when: /wen/

Vowel
A vowel letter that makes one sound, is closed off by one or more consonants.

Multisyllabic Words- 4 and 5 syllables (Set 2)

intentional **enormously** **irrational** **star**

Vowel-r
A vowel is followed by the letter r. The letter r controls the sound of the vowel.

le
A vowel sound that is only found at the end of words.

va
A vowel sound that doesn't sound like the letter it represents. It's a short, neutral vowel sound.

Syllables
Syllables are the parts of a word that have an odd sound.

pen, when, when, when, when, when
pen: /pen/ when: /wen/ when: /wen/ when: /wen/ when: /wen/ when: /wen/

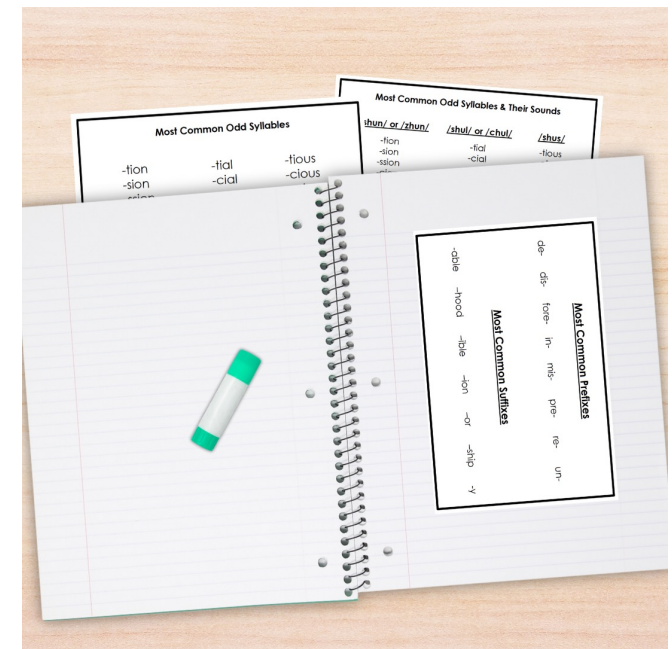

The posters come in a convenient bookmark and one sheet version.

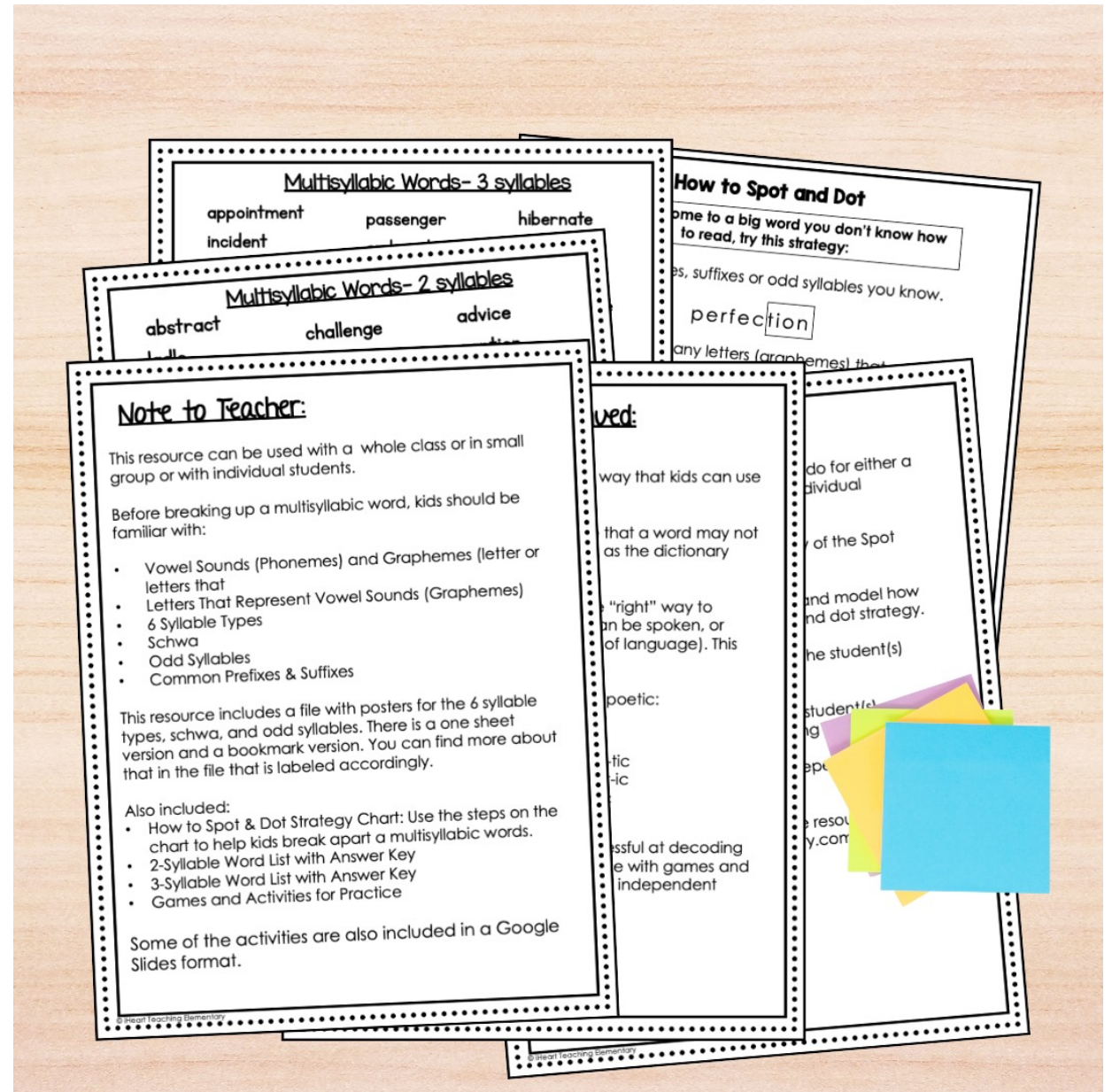
